BOYS HIGH SCHOOL SWIMMING

The Hagerstown Boys Tiger Shark Swim team competed in Sectional Prelims Thursday evening at New Palestine.

The boys swam well and many had personal record times for the evening. The Tigers have swimmers advancing to Saturday Sectional for the consolation, top 16 race and one swimmer, Senior, Tyler Wilson advancing individually to the finals, top 8 in the 100 Breaststroke. The relay team for the Medley and 200 Free will compete in the finals also.

The following are PRs and swimmers advancing to Saturday:

Senior, Tyler Wilson placed 9th in the 200 Free and 7th in the 100 Breaststroke. Both events he recorded personal best times. Also he will be swimming in finals for the Medley Relay and 200 Free Relay.

Senior Alexander McKee, placed 12th and recorded a PR in the 50 freestyle. He also placed 14th and had a PR in the 100 freestyle. He will compete in consolation race for Saturday in the 50

and 100 freestyle. He will also be swimming in the finals for the Medley Relay and 200 Free Relay.

Seniors Logan Tuttle and Josh Grams recorded personal best times in the 50 freestyle.

Junior Andrew Turner placed 15th in the 200 IM and had a personal record time for this event. He also placed 16th in the 100 Butterfly. Andrew will compete on Saturday in both events in the consolation race. He will also be swimming in the finals for the Medley Relay and the 200 Freestyle Relay with his team.

Sophomore James Cochran placed 16th in the 100 Backstroke with a PR and will compete on Saturday in the consolation race. He is also part of the 200 Freestyle Relay team that will be in the finals.

Freshman Ryan Hill placed 20th in the Backstroke and had a personal best time. He also placed 23rd in the 200 IM with a PR. Ryan is a part of the Medley Relay team that will compete in the finals on Saturday.

Freshman Noah Newman placed 21st in the 100 breaststroke.
