

TRACK

Track Squads Open Indoor Season with Success

The Tiger track squads opened their indoor seasons at the Burris Owl Invite at Ball State University. The Tiger boys won five of the eight events in which they competed and earned the top team spot of fourteen schools. ndividual event winners included Ryan Golliher in shot with a personal best and small-school state leading 53-3, Dylan Napier in high jump (5-10), and Holden Robinson in the 60 Hurdles (PR 9.12). Also earning firsts were the 4 x 800 relay team of Alexander McKee, Adam Nadler, Quentin Osborne, and Logan Tuttle (8:58.47) and the 4 x 400 team of McKee, Tuttle, Napier, and Robinson (3:42.21). Eli Halcomb was second in the 3200 (10:32.35), and the DMR team of Osborne, Kent Caudill, Nadler, and Halcomb also placed second (12:21.0). Jadon Locke was fourth in shot with a personal best toss of 45-.5, while Caudill earned a sixth spot in high jump (5-4) and a seventh in the

60 Hurdles (10.83) and Robinson finished sixth in the 60 dash (7.68).

Top Four Team Scores: HHS 79, Monroe Central 65.5, Rushville 61, Delta 55.5

For the ladies, seconds were earned by the 4 x 200 squad of Abby Hill, Mya Edwards, Ella Nicholson, and Maddie Pruitt (2:02.49), and the 4 x 400 squad of Abby Hill, Jewels Warfel, Taylor Pass, and Nicholson (4:58.69). Fourths were taken by Pruitt in high jump (4-10), the 4 x 800 team consisting of Warfel, Pass, Teresa Rojas, and Nicholson (12:16.29), and the DMR group of Maci Matanich, Makynna Matanich, Makayla Matanich, and Anna Shafer (17:06.9). Shafer was eighth in the 3200 (14:30.73). Edwards also performed quite well as an individual, earning a fourth place in the 60 Hurdles (11.18) and sixth in the 60 dash (8.78). Kaelynn Shultz and Kassidy Oliger went five, six in shot with Shultz besting Oliger by two inches, 31-0 to 30-10.
