VARSITY BASEBALL

The Tigers stroll to 9-0 defeating Winchester 4-0. It wasn't the prettiest game ever played, that is unless you value the beauty of great pitching. Today pitted two great TEC pitchers against each other in Hagerstown Junior Brady McMillan and Winchester Senior Glenallen Anderson who will be pitching next season at Wilmington. McMillan is credited with a complete game victory on just 89 pitches including 5 strikeouts and zero walks. His opponent went 5 innings striking out 6 and walking only 2 Tiger batters. Impressive numbers in less than ideal weather conditions...

The highlight of the day, came in the top of the third in a scoreless game, when struggling senior Mason Hicks led off with a slump busting hard single to the gap. Mason was about to set the tone by showing how to contribute even while struggling at the plate. Two pitches later, Mason advanced to a vacant third base on a sacrifice bunt by Clay Cochran, thus drawing an errant throw and breaking the tie by scoring from first on the bunt. It was just the spark the Tigers needed

and proved to be the only run necessary to earn the win.

The Tigers did manage 9 hits, 2 by Noah Dale (1 rbi) and 2 by Collin Romack (1 rbi) who blasted a double in the 4th and later scored on a fielder's choice and an error. McMillan, Vinson, Swimm, Rhoades, and Hicks added the other hits.

Weather permitting, the Tigers will play at home tomorrow on Lloyd Michael field at 5pm vs Franklin County...

JR. HIGH TRACK & FIELD

Both Girls' and Boys' track and field teams are now 2 - 1 on the season having vanquished Knightstown and Lincoln while falling to Richmond in hard-fought contests.

Last Thursday the teams faced Knightstown and won handily, especially the girls' team. The girls' team defeated Knightstown 66/30 while the boys' team defeated Knightstown with a score of 56/44.

Many participants on both teams had noted performances in this meet, but there is one standout performance that requires special

attention which is that of 7th-grader Kasiti Ferriell. In the last leg of the 4x4 where each participant runs an entire length of the 400 meter track, Kasiti found herself a quarter of the track behind her opponent when she received the baton for her leg.

Kasiti was undeterred about this fact and showed no respect toward the idea of defeat. She started her leg of the race as a girl on a mission. Not only did she catch the Knightstown girl, but she beat her handily allowing the squad to claim victory. You see in relays for a dual meet, second place earns no points.
