

BASEBALL

Tiger baseball remains unbeaten after a swampy sweep of Blackford County 10-3 and 4-1 on Lloyd Michael Field. It took 6 Tiger pitchers to accomplish this daunting task versus a Bruins team who proved competitive at the plate...

Game 1 featured Junior Brady McMillan who added another victory to his already impressive list of accomplishments. After pitching a no hitter last year versus this same Bruins squad, McMillan had a difficult third inning allowing 2 walks, 3 hits, and 3 earned runs. But that would be all he would afford the Bruins before being replaced in the 5th by Sophomore Sensation Dominic Anderson.... Anderson earned the save going the final three frames facing just 10 batters, striking out 6 and walking 2 on zero hits.

The Tigers also busted out the lumber in game 1 racking up 13 hits and 3 walks, while striking out just 3 times. Cody Swimm led the way going 3-4 with a double, triple, 3 runs, and 4 rbi. Vinson, Rhoades, Anderson, and Cochran each added 2 hits, with McMillan and Hicks (2b) earning a hit

each. McMillan also added two runs, as did Hicks with Rhoades adding 2 rbi.

Game 2 saw the Tigers return to an old strategy of "pitcher by committee." Grant Vinson got his second start and victory of the season throwing 3 innings allowing 5 hits and just 1 earned run while striking out 6. Noah Dale then saw his first action of the season throwing the next 2 frames allowing no hits. Derek Davis threw a hitless 6th, and Cody Swimm finished the game earning the save while striking out 2 of three batters faced and also allowing no Bruin hits.

The Tiger hitters were only able to earn 7 hits in game 2 against a formidable pitcher who managed to change speeds and keep the Tigers off balance. With 2 outs in the second and runners on 2nd and 3rd, Derek Davis broke a scoreless game with a 2 rbi single scoring both McMillan and Dale which proved to be all the runs needed to secure the victory. Romack finished the game with 2 hits while Vinson, Swimm, Cochran, Dale, and Davis added 1 each...

It was nice to knock the rust off after only playing 2 games in 14 days due to poor weather. The

Tigers will have their hands full as they travel to conference rival Northeastern Tuesday.

VARSITY TRACK & FIELD

Tigers Dominate Park Tudor Track Invite

Seeking new opponents, the Hagerstown track squads traveled to Indianapolis to compete in the twelve-school Park Tudor Track and Field Invitational. Both Tiger squads returned to East-Central Indiana with championship trophies won in dominant fashion.

"We were looking for some fresh faces, and I felt the Park Tudor Invite would give us good competition, which proved to be true" commented head coach Kent Gray. "What surprised me were our point totals given that only six places were awarded. We performed very well across the board and placed many above their seeds."

The Tiger girls tallied 160.5 points and the Tiger boys 152 points. The Tigers won four of six relay races, girls 4 x 800 and 4 x 100, boys 4 x 800 and 4 x 400, and produced numerous individual winners and personal best performances. Ryan Golliher remained undefeated in shot and disc; throwing the disc beyond the range of Park

Tudor's venue, his winning toss was listed at 154-4, but the actual distance is unknown as the baseball outfield fence his disc hit was measured at that distance. Holden Robinson earned three individual firsts, 110 HH, 100, 300 IH, and also anchored the 4 x 400 team. Maddie Pruitt's winning high jump of 5-1 set a meet record; teammate Abby Dale was close behind at 5-0 for second. Logan Tuttle easily won the boys 800, Dylan Napier took the high jump, Ashley Vinson won the 100, Kaelynn Shultz took shot with Kassidy Oliger placing second, and Oliger dominated the disc with a personal best throw of 107 feet, thirteen feet beyond the next closest opponent. The Tigers placed at least one competitor in the top six in every single event.
