## **VARSITY TRACK**

### **Tiger Boys Win, Girls Tie in Quadrangular Meet**

Hagerstown boys' track team finished first in a four-way meet with Delta, Monroe Central, and Union City while the Lady Tigers tied with Delta for the top team spot. Though the weather was blustery, the competition was intense with many personal bests, dramatic finishes, and even a school record. Final team scores for the boys were HHS 105, Delta 60, Monroe Central 54, and Union City 6. The girls' tallies were HHS 90, Delta 90, Monroe Central 45, and Union City 3.

Holden Robinson led the Tiger boys with wins in the 110 HH, the 300 IH in a school-record time of 39.4, and the 4 x 400 relay along with teammates Alexander McKee, Zack Sherrow, and Logan Tuttle. Ryan Gollither was a double winner in shot and disc. Jaylon Favorite won the 400 with a dramatic come-from-behind push over the last 50 meters, and the 4 x 800 team of McKee, Adam Nadler, Osborne, and Tuttle also took first place.

Quentin Osborne was the top competitor in the 3200, closely followed by Blake Creek and Adam Nadler for a 1, 2, 3 Tiger finish.

On the ladies' side, the highlight of the meet was capturing the top three spots in both the shot and disc and gutsy performances by Ella Nicholson, Jewels Warfel, Taylor Pass, and Kayla Vinson. Vinson won the 200 and contributed to a win in the 4 x 100 along with Nicholson, Jessica Swimm, and Maddie Pruitt. The Tigers also captured the 4 x 400 relay with a great final leg by Nicholson who teamed with Warfel, Pass, and Hallie Rogers.

Coach Kent Gray commented on his teams' effort, "Our performance tonight was inspiring. We have kids out with injuries, people still on spring break vacations, and we didn't miss a beat. People stepped up, filled in, and we competed with heart and pride. I'm exceptionally proud of all our athletes."

## **Tiger Track Teams Win Against New Castle**

Hagerstown's girls and boys track and field teams won their opening meets against New Castle at home on Tuesday. The girls bested the Trojans 98-23 and boys 91-27. All teams were short of athletes due to spring break absences, but the depth of the Tigers proved the difference in the meet.

Top female performers for HHS included Ella Nicholson who won the 800 and anchored the 4 x 800 relay, Anna Shafer who won the 1600 and 3200, Maddie Pruitt who won high jump, 300 hurdles and anchored the 4 x 100, Mya Edwards won the 100 hurdles and ran lead-off in the 4 x 100, and the entire Tiger throwing squads-- Kaelynn Shultz, Kassidy Oliger, and Abby Adams swept shot, while Oliger, Laney Adams, and Abby Adams also took the top three spots in disc.

On the boys side, Holden Robinson was the top point man, winning the 110 hurdles, 300 hurdles, anchoring the 4 x 400 squad and placing second in the 100. Other boys with multiple firsts included Jaylon Favorite in 200, long jump, and 4 x 100,



Logan Tuttle in 800, 4 x 800, 4 x 400, and Alexander McKee 4 x 800, 4x 400. Adam Nadler and Quentin Osborne ran very well in the distance races, and Favorite, Zack Sherrow, and Branton Payne swept the 200. Like the girls, the boys also captured all places in the throws--Ryan Gollither, Jadon Locke, and Kyler Shultz swept shot, while Locke, Gollither and Bryson Adams took the disc.
