VARSITY SOFTBALL

The varsity softball season got underway over spring break. The Lady Tigers lost the home opener to National Trail 17-2 on **Monday, April 1**. Aubrey Andecover was in the circle for the Tiger and allowed 11 hits and 15 runs over four innings, striking out one. Emma Hicks threw one inning in relief out of the bullpen. Hicks, Carlie Morris, Andecover, Meghan Dale, and Marissa Slagle each collected one hit to lead the Tigers,

On **Wednesday, April 3**, the Lady Tigers traveled to Monroe Central. Tigers fired up the offense in the first inning when Marissa Slagle drove in one on a single, but Monroe Central evened things up on a solo homerun in the bottom of the first. Monroe Central pulled away for good with two runs in the third inning. Emma Hicks was in the circle for the Lady Tigers. She went four innings, allowing four runs on five hits and striking out three. Tori Kelley threw two innings in relief. The Tigers totaled seven hits. Slagle and Hicks each managed two hits to lead the Tigers.

On **Thursday, April 4**, the Lady Tigers opened conference play at Union County. The Tigers watched the game slip away early and couldn't recover in an 11-1 loss. The Tigers struggled to put runs on the board and had a tough time defensively containing Union County. Tori Kelley took the loss for the Tigers, allowing 13 hits and 11 runs over 4 innings. Emma Hicks led the Tigers with three hits in three at bats, while Marissa Slagle hit in the Tigers lone run.

The Lady Tigers are back in action **Saturday** at the Richmond Invitational Tournament.

Tiger Track Teams Split with Wapahani

Hagerstown's boys track team defeated Wapahani in a home meet on Monday, 88-35; however, the Lady Tigers fell to Wapahani 78-45. The boys' squad is now 5-0 on the season, the girls' 3-1-1.

Holden Robinson again led on the track, capturing four blue ribbons in the 110 HH, 100, 300 IH and 4 x 400. Ryan Golliher led in the field with another double win in the shot and disc.

Other firsts went to Dylan Napier in high jump and the 400, Logan Tuttle in the 800, and Jaylon Favorite in the 200. The Tigers also won all three relays. Alexander McKee, Adam Nadler, Quentin Osborne, and Tuttle teamed up for the win in the 4 x 800. Caleb Lovvorn, Branton Payne, Zack Sherrow, and Favorite took the 4 x 100, and Favorite, McKee, Tuttle, and Robinson took blue in the 4 x 400 with a season-best time of 3:35.3.

Many Lady Tigers posted season and personal bests, but firsts were hard to come by against a talented Wapahani squad. Haven Ragen won the 400 for the only Tiger first on the track, but HHS did win three of four field events with Jessica Swimm taking the long jump, Kaelynn Shultz the shot, and Kassidy Oliger the disc.
