## 21st Century Scholars

### 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Parents:

#### Your children may be eligible for a college scholarship

Indiana's 21st Century Scholars program offers income-eligible Hoosier students up to four years of paid tuition at an eligible Indiana college or university after they graduate from high school, dependent upon financial need. In middle and high school, Scholars are connected to programs and resources to help them stay on track for college and career success. Once in college, Scholars receive support to complete their college degrees and connect to career opportunities. 7th and 8th grade Indiana students whose families meet income eligibility guidelines can apply to become a 21st Century Scholar. **Applications must be received by June 30 of the student's 8th grade year.**

In return for keeping the Scholar Pledge and meeting the expectations of the Scholar Success Program throughout high school and college, the Commission for Higher Education commits to providing Scholars with up to four years of undergraduate tuition assistance at an eligible Indiana college or university, dependent on financial need.

As a Scholar, you pledge to:

- ✓ Complete the Scholar Success Program, which includes activities at each grade level in high school to help you stay on track for college and career success.
- ✓ Graduate from a state-accredited high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma and a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- ✓ Not use illegal drugs, commit a crime or delinquent act, or consume alcohol before reaching the legal drinking age.
- ✓ File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by April 15 as a high school senior and each year thereafter until you graduate from college.
- ✓ Apply to an eligible Indiana college as a high school senior, and enroll as a full-time student within one year of high school graduation.
- ✓ Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards established by my college.
- ✓ Complete 30 credit hours each year you are in college to stay on track toward earning your degree on time.

#### Apply online at [Scholars.IN.gov](http://Scholars.IN.gov) and provide:

- Student's Social Security Number, date of birth and address.
- Parent or guardian's Social Security Number or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number, if applicable.
- 2017 gross income amounts for *all members* of the household. If applying after December 31, 2018, use 2018 gross income.
- A valid email address (free email accounts are available at Yahoo.com, Gmail.com, Hotmail.com, and Live.com).



# Tiger Results

## **VARSITY TRACK & FIELD**

### **HHS Track Teams First, Second at TEC Meet**

Hagerstown's boys' track squad captured its fifth consecutive TEC title on Thursday at Northeastern, scoring 160 points. The Tigers won six events and placed two contestants in every individual event. Meet highlights included Holden Robinson's meet record 39.2 in the 300 hurdles, Ryan Golliher's double win in shot and disc, a 1-2 finish by Logan Tuttle and Adam Nadler in the 800, convincing wins by both the 4 x 400 and 4 x 800 relay squads, outstanding performances by Jaylon Favorite and Branton Payne in both the 200 and long jump, and personal best performances by Zack Sherrow and Dylan Napier in the 400. Many Tigers placed above their seeds, and the 70 point bulge over second-place Winchester was one of the more lopsided in TEC history. Robinson's 22.5 points led the boys in scoring.

The ladies came up just four points shy of a well-performing Centerville team 113-117. Kaelynn Shultz won an individual title in shot put

with teammate Kassidy Olinger placing second. Olinger and Laney Adams also went 2-3 in discus, both with personal best tosses, to total 32 points in the throws for the Tigers. Other outstanding performances came from Ella Nicholson in the 800 (2nd, PB), from Ashley Vinson and Madison Pruitt in the sprints where both recorded personal bests in the 200 at 27.93 and 28.20 respectively, and Anna Shafer's season best run in the 3200. Pruitt was the top point-scorer for the girls with a total of 18.

### **Tigers capture County Tourney**

The Tigers' toughness was challenged for nearly 6 straight hours Saturday as they battled toward victory in the Wayne County Tourney. With rain coming, there was only time for a short respite between the opening match where the Tigers defeated Centerville 19-7, and the championship game where they bested Northeastern 7-5.

In game 1, the Tigers took an early lead after plating 2 in their half of the first inning. That lead however, was short lived as the young and feisty Bulldogs added 3 of their own in the bottom of the same frame. Hagerstown starter Grant Vinson was replaced in the bottom of the second inning by senior Derek Davis who would earn his first victory of the season. The Bulldogs took their 3-2 lead into the third where the Tiger bats got hot leading to a 9 run inning and a lead that wouldn't be matched. Cade Johnson would finish the victory on the mound pitching the final frame striking out 3 of 4 Bulldog batters.

Grant Vinson led the offense with 3 hits and 4 rbi. Noah Dale also had three hits and Cam Rhoades added 2.

In a well fought championship game, the Tigers once again jumped out to an early lead, plating

two runners in their half of the first. They would fight to maintain that lead as a determined Northeastern squad vied to keep the contest within reach.

Starter Cody Swimm offered the Tigers three innings, striking out 5 and earning his 7th win of the season. Noah Dale replaced Swimm and kept the game in check until being replaced by Dom Anderson in the 5th inning. Anderson ended up throwing 3 complete allowing only 1 hit while striking out 7 of the 9 Knights' outs he recorded.

The Tigers were led once again on offense by Grant Vinson who tallied 2 hits including a HR. Rhoades also added two hits. Rhoades, Dale, and McMillan all added doubles as well.

Hats off to a tough Northeastern squad who battled til the end in a tight game sure to benefit both programs.

### **Tigers Lose Lead Early in Defeat**

Thursday, May 9 - Tigers watched the game slip away early and couldn't recover in a 9-2 loss to Northeastern on Thursday. Northeastern scored
