

VARSITY BASEBALL

Tigers win TEC!!!!

This is the 8th conference championship for the Tigers in 9 years. This victory is also #20 on the season for the Tigers as they head into tonight's Senior Day contest versus Union City.

Cody Swimm picked up win number 7 on the season and was impressive once again allowing just 1 hit while striking out 10 in 4 1/3 innings.

Dom “the bomb” Anderson replaced Swimm in the 5th inning striking out the final two Titan batters to secure the 12-2 victory.

The bats were hot once again and so was Cody Swimm who was 3-4 with a home run and 2rbi. Fellow senior Grant Vinson was 2-2 with a home run, a triple, and 4rbi. Rhoades, Anderson, Hicks, and Cochran all added hits as well.

In action earlier this week, the Tigers brought home win number 19 against Rushville. In fact, it was a quartet of Tiger hurlers who held Rushville in check Tuesday leading Hagerstown to an 8-3 victory and a season record of 19-1.

The majority of mound time Tuesday evening was divided between Derek Davis, who received his first start of the season, and his not so little cousin Cade Johnson. Davis got off to a great start facing just 9 Lion batters thru the first three innings. On the day, Davis pitched 4 innings, striking out 9 and walking zero. Johnson relieved Davis in the 5th striking out 2. Sophomore sensation Dominic David Anderson finished the sixth striking out both Lion batters faced. Senior Noah Dale made quick work of the opposition in the 7th with three up and three down including a strike out. In total, the quartet of Tiger pitchers

struck out 14 while walking three and allowing just 6 hits.

The offense was led by several Tiger batters who tallied 11 hits. Camden “Deno” Rhoades owned 3 of those hits including 2 doubles and 2 rbi. Mason Hicks also added 2 doubles and 1 rbi. Cody Swimm and Clay Cochran matched Hicks with 2 hits and an rbi. Brady McMillan and Dom Anderson each added a hit as well.
