

## **Tiger Results**

### **VARSITY TRACK & FIELD**

#### **Track Teams Combine to Win Tiger Booster Invitational**

The boys' and girls' track squads scored 234 points to win the combined team trophy at the 37th annual Tiger Booster Track and Field invitational on Friday. The boys tally of 138 points was first of twelve schools and 57 points more than second-place Covenant Christian. The ladies earned 96 points for a second place finish, just nine points behind Franklin County.

Ryan Golliher remained undefeated in shot and disc. His shot put of 52-6.5 set a new Tiger Booster record, and his discus toss of 156-4 established a new school record. Golliher was the



top point individual among field event competitors. Holden Robinson was the top point man overall for the Tigers, scoring 24.5 points, remaining unbeaten in the 300 hurdles, placing second in the 110 hurdles, fifth in the 100 dash, and anchoring the undefeated 4 x 400. Jaylon Favorite, Logan Tuttle, Dylan Napier, and Robinson ran the second fastest time in school history in the 4 x 400 at 3:30.53. Tuttle also remained unbeaten in the 800, capturing that race in just over 2:01; in addition, he anchor the likewise unbeaten 4 x 800 of Braden Himelick, Adam Nadler, Quentin Osborne, and Tuttle, which ran a season-best time of 8:41.94.

Abby Dale was Tiger Booster champion in the high jump at 5-0, the only first for the ladies. However, there were many excellent performances including Jessica Swimm, second 300 hurdles and top point earner for the girls with 18.5 points, Ella Nicholson, second 800, personal best times in the 400 by both Hallie Rogers and Haven Ragen, in the 200 by Ashley Vinson, and in the 300 hurdles by Ella Warvel, and an all-around excellent meet by Jewels Warfel. Other efforts of note included excellent runs in the 1600 and 3200

by the senior distance tandem of Anna Shafer and Maci Matanich.

## **VARSITY BASEBALL**

The Tiger Nine improved their record to 13-1 and took a commanding lead in the TEC by defeating perennial rival and defending conference champions Union County 10-3 Monday afternoon on Lloyd Michael field.

The stands were full and it was finally a beautiful afternoon for some Tiger baseball. On this day, the Tigers would not disappoint. After suffering their only defeat of the season just two days prior,

the Tigers baseballers regrouped and returned to form piecing together a complete team effort to secure the victory.

Once again, Cody Swimm proved dominant on the mound earning his 5th victory of the season. On the day Cody pitched 6 innings allowing just 3 hits while striking out 9 and surrendering 1 earned run versus the 8th ranked Patriots. Sophomore sensation Dominic David Anderson earned his 5th save of the season striking out 2 of three batters he faced in the 7th.

However, the theme of the day was unselfish team-centered baseball. Today's victory included 4 sacrifice bunts, including a squeeze play, a sac fly, great defensive plays by Brady McMillan and Derek Davis getting out of a jam on a nice double play, Noah Dale on a diving catch, and Grant Vinson tracking a hard hit ball down at the fence.

Offensively, the Tigers were led again by Cody Swimm's three hits including a double and a triple and 1 rbi. Grant Vinson added 2 doubles and an rbi. Noah Dale 1-2 with 2 sac bunts and an rbi. Cam Rhoades with a sac fly and 1 rbi. Dom Anderson 1-2. Mason Hicks 1-2 with a home run and 2 runs scored. And Collin Romack 1-2...

It doesn't get any easier for the Tigers who travel to Centerville **TODAY** for another conference matchup versus arguably the hottest team in the TEC who has won 5 out of their last 6 contests.
