VARSITY BASEBALL

In the world of baseball, The Tiger Nine advanced their record to 14-1 by defeating the Centerville Bulldogs 8-0 on the road. Brady McMillan continued his winning ways by earning his sixth victory of the season. Brady pitched 5 scoreless innings allowing 5 hits while striking out 4 and offering 0 walks. Dom “the bomb” Anderson earned his 6th save of the season pitching the final 2 frames striking out 4 and allowing 0 hits.

Following last night’s big win versus Union County, the Tigers struggled to find their groove but were still able to piece together a nice victory against an improving and pesky Bulldog squad.

Dalton Stevens pitched an excellent game for the Dogs going 6 complete. Just what the Tigers expected from the veteran right hander.

The Tiger offense was led by senior Mason Hicks who tallied 3 of the Tigers' 11 hits. A nice follow-up to his excellent performance a night earlier which included a big home run. Cody Swimm and Clay Cochran added 2 hits each and Derek Davis provided much of the early run production with 2 rbi including a sac fly and a suicide squeeze. Vinson, Rhoades, Anderson, and McMillan each had a hit as well.

The Tigers travel to Eastern Hancock Thursday and on Saturday, travel to Lincoln for the county tourney where they will face Centerville once again in game two around 11:30 am.
