Tiger Results

BPA

Last week six students from Hagerstown High School BPA flew to California to compete in the BPA National Convention - Megan Craig, Shay Doerstler, Ashlynn Oliger, Kassidy Oliger, Sierra Searcy and Mackenzie Slagle. The theme for the 2019 National Contest was "Together We Create" and together the six students did create. They created memories that will last a lifetime.

We flew in to LAX on Wednesday and began our bus ride to Anaheim where the convention was held. The six students competed Wednesday evening in the Parliamentary Procedure Open consisting of multiple choice questions. The

students did not have any contests on Thursday so we spent the entire day at the Disneyland parks. Friday morning, Kassidy Olinger was up early to compete in her national contest Intermediate Word Processing which was quickly followed by the Parliamentary Procedure Team Event.

After the contests were over on Friday, we spent the day at Huntington Beach and Seal Beach enjoying the sites. The last item to check off the bucket list for this trip was an adventure into Hollywood and Beverly Hills. We rented an SUV and Mrs. Olinger got the experience of driving in California traffic - definitely not what she is used to driving in. We walked the Walk the Fame, saw the famous Hollywood sign, drove down Rodeo Drive and then headed back to Anaheim for the awards program. While we had nobody on stage, we did compete while in California. Kassidy Olinger placed 14 out of 67 students in her individual contest and the Parliamentary Procedure team placed 16 out of 22 teams. They did score the Parliamentary Procedure Open Concepts exam and our top students were Kassidy Olinger (41/346) and Shay Doerstler (122/346). The trip was a success for

the HHS students and they are hoping for a chance to go to Washington, D.C., next year for the BPA National Convention.
