## **VOLLEYBALL**

The Varsity Volleyball team captured the Monroe Central Invitational by defeating Lincoln 25-16, 25-5, South Adams 25-17, 25-17, and Monroe Central in the championship 25-10, 25-11. Hallie Rogers set 60 assists on the day, Kenzie Slagle served 28 points with 9 aces, Carli Morris had 24 digs and 20 points, Regan Tinkle had 25 kills and 16 points, Jessica Swimm 20 kills, and Alexis Ellis 12 blocks on the day. The Tigers raise their record to 15-2 on the season.

The Junior Varsity defeated Daleville 25-15, 25-12 and lost in the championship to South Adams 20-25 and 24-25. Makayla Matanich had 15 points (5 aces) and 10 kills, Makynna Matanich had 9 digs, Allison Ayotte had 14 points and 28 assists, Gwen Cox 13 digs, and Mackenzie Johnson had 9 kills. Their record is 10-2.

The volleyball teams travel to Tri tonight and will be home with Lincoln on Thursday.

## **JR. HIGH CROSS COUNTRY**

It was a busy first week of competition for junior high, co-ed cross country.

Last Tuesday, the teams faced Centerville and Union County at home. Each team fell to Centerville while besting Union County. The girls who scored were Mary Lach, 4th; Savannah Cross, 9th; Alana Stamper, 11th; Avery Blunk, 12th; and Bentley Ankrom, 14th.

The boys who scored were Brock Creech, 3rd; Bryce Tinkle, 5th; Ethan Bymaster, 7th; Cory Nash, 9th; and Matthew Laster, 14th.

Last Thursday, the teams competed in the Wayne County Invitational held at I.U. East. Neither team performed to its standard that evening as both teams finished last in the standings, but there were notable individual performances.

Special recognition goes to Mary Lach for earning all-county honors by finishing 10th among a competitive field. Other girls who scored were Savannah Cross, 17th; Zoe Meek, 24th; Alana Stamper, 27th; and Bentley Ankrom, 28th.

The boys were led by Brock Creech, 16th; Bryce Tinkle, 21st; Cory Nash, 24th; Ethan Bymaster, 32nd; and Rizael Payne, 35th.

On Saturday, 9/14, the teams traveled to Randolph Southern for its invitational where they faced a diverse and competitive field which included schools of much larger size than our own. Against the field, the teams performed better than Thursday and a number of individuals improved personal performances.

On the day, the girls managed 9th of 14 teams while the boys managed 11th of 16 teams. Scoring girls included Mary Lach, 26th; Savannah Cross, 53rd; Zoe Meek, 54th; Bentley Ankrom, 82nd; and Alana Stamper, 86th.

The boys who scored were Brock Creech, 33rd; Cory Nash, 62nd; Bryce Tinkle, 81st; Ethan Bymaster, 86th; and Rizael Payne, 111th.
