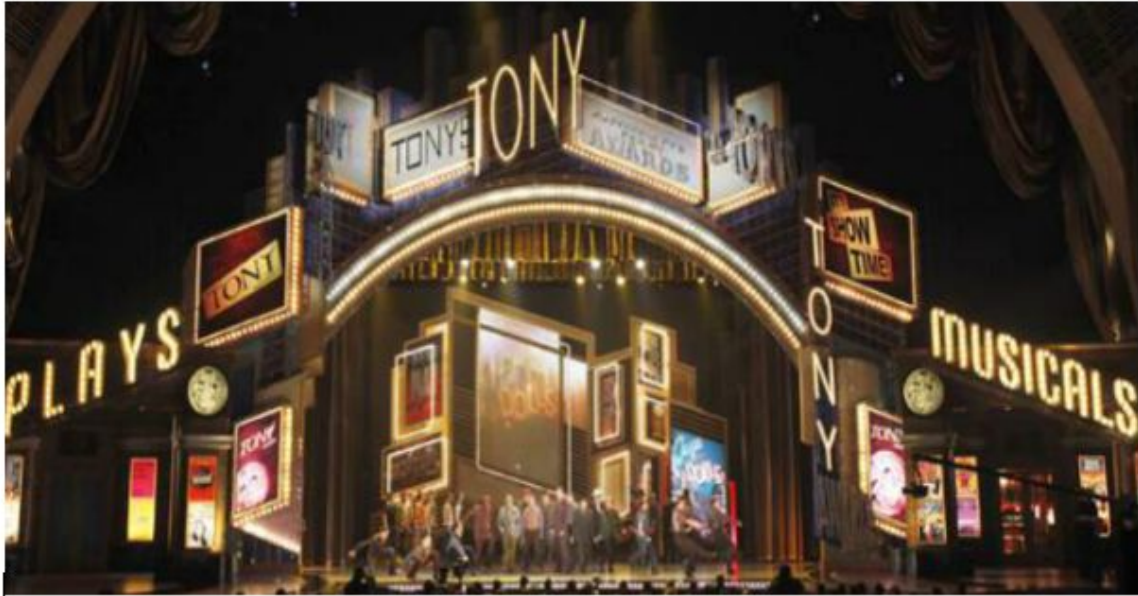

## **JUNIORS & SENIORS**

**Mrs. Arnold has information about the following:**

You may be eligible to apply for the United States Senate Youth Program, sponsored by the Hearst Foundation. Two Indiana students will be selected to earn a **\$10,000 college scholarship** and an **all-expense-paid trip** to Washington, D.C. on March 7-14, 2020.

Eligible students are high school juniors and seniors who are currently serving in leadership roles in student government:

- Student body president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer
- Class president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer
- Student council representative
- National Honor Society officer (including discipline-based Honor Society such as the National English and Social Studies Honor Societies that include service components)

- Student representative elected or appointed to a district, regional, or state level civic or educational organization.

Mrs. Arnold has documents explaining the program, including a timeline of events, the application, summary of rules, and the official brochure. Applications, essay, and letter of recommendation are due to the Indiana Bar Foundation by **October 7, 2019**. Finalists will be informed of an in-person interview, scheduled for **October 26**.
