MISSION TO MARS

Mission to Mars: Mars Colony STEAM Program

Can you imagine what it would be like to inhabit Mars? Jennifer Taylor, from the Hagerstown Public Library, will lead students in a hands-on project in the Tiger Library during study hall to explore that possibility. Project sessions will give students an opportunity to learn about current efforts to colonize Mars and the harsh environment of its barren world. Students will research and brainstorm engineering and mental health design solutions to keep colonists alive, healthy and happy. The final colony design will be put to the test with various scenarios and an opportunity will be given to provide students materials to build a replica of their colony design. As part of this program, students will be shown the movie *The Martian*, which NASA has lauded for its fiction and factual narratives of the technologies that exist and exploration work that NASA has done to

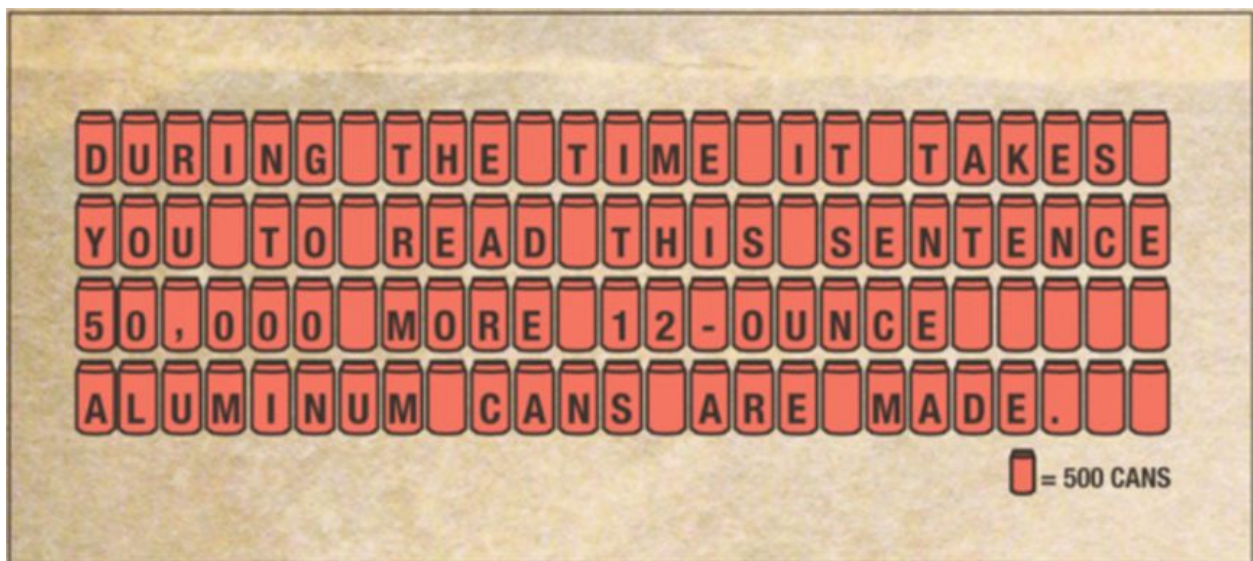
date as well as reflecting things that are currently being worked on.

Sessions will occur during study halls on October 4, October 18, November 1, November 15, December 6, and optionally December 20 if additional work time is needed. 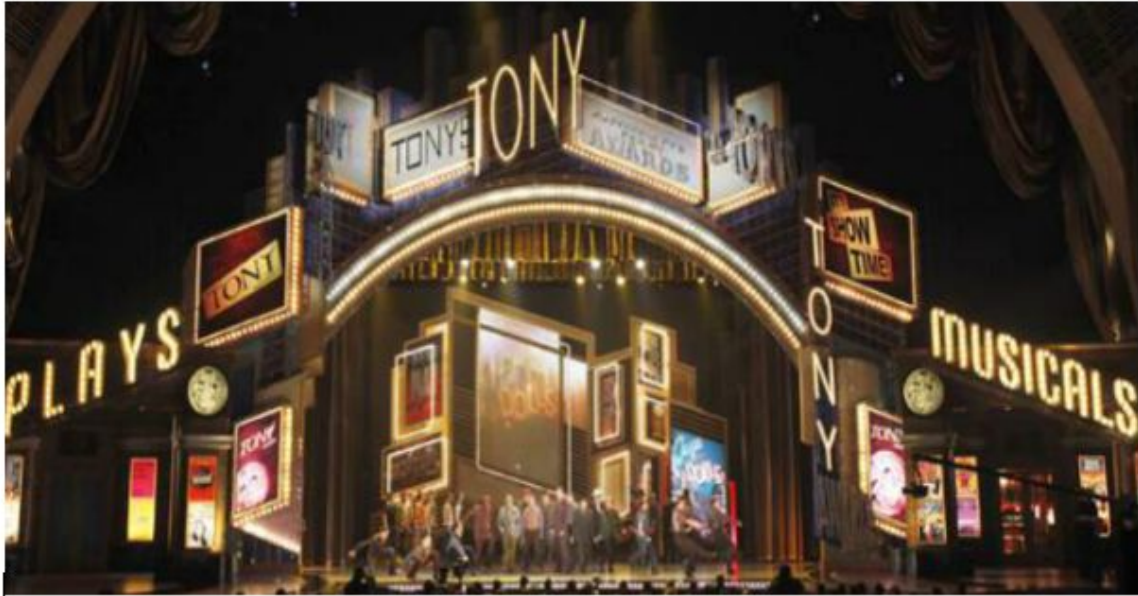

JUNIORS & SENIORS

Mrs. Arnold has information about the following:

You may be eligible to apply for the United States Senate Youth Program, sponsored by the Hearst Foundation. Two Indiana students will be selected to earn a **\$10,000 college scholarship** and an **all-expense-paid trip** to Washington, D.C. on March 7-14, 2020.

Eligible students are high school juniors and seniors who are currently serving in leadership roles in student government:

- Student body president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer
- Class president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer
- Student council representative
- National Honor Society officer (including discipline-based Honor Society such as the National English and Social Studies Honor Societies that include service components)

- Student representative elected or appointed to a district, regional, or state level civic or educational organization.

Mrs. Arnold has documents explaining the program, including a timeline of events, the application, summary of rules, and the official brochure. Applications, essay, and letter of recommendation are due to the Indiana Bar Foundation by **October 7, 2019**. Finalists will be informed of an in-person interview, scheduled for **October 26**. CROSS COUNTRY

Halcomb Wins Connersville CC Invitational

Running in a field of seventeen schools and 153 athletes, **Eli Halcomb** won the individual title at the Connersville Cross Country Invitational Tuesday evening and led his team to a second-place finish. Halcomb's time of 17:14.5 was excellent on the rigorous Connersville course. Halcomb stated after his race, "I tried not to go out too hard and run a consistent pace. It paid off as I was leaving the field by the 2-mile mark, and I felt good at the finish." Teammate Quentin Osborne was just out of the top ten at eleventh, and Quaid Mull and Blake Creech finished 18th and 19th. Adam Nadler completed the scoring at 29th. Carter Jenkins was 50th and Joey Auker 63rd, placing them well in the top half of the field. David Holt was the best finisher in the reserve race for HHS at 23rd. The boys are now 53-6 on the season.

The Lady Tigers faced a strong field and finished a very respectable seventh as a team. Top seven scoring places: Ava Moore 18, Ella Nicholson 22, Jewels Warfel 38, Taylor Pass 42, Jenna Smith 45, Teresa Rojas 50, Madelynn Ward 54. Coach Kent Gray spoke about the girls' race, "I felt our ladies finished well given the high level of competition. There were two teams in the field tonight that will win sectional championship, and each team above us will certainly qualify for regionals. Based on this, I think our girls will have a good shot at regional qualification as well." Sisters Kassidy and Delaney Olinger finished sixth and seventh in the reserve race. The girls' team record stands at 42-16.
