

Tiger Results CROSS COUNTRY

Boys CC Wins Division at Shelbyville, Girls Finish Fourth

The Hagerstown boys' cross country team won its third invitational within three weeks by capturing the Gold Division Race at the Shelbyville Golden Bear Invite. The Gold Division race featured 15 teams of mostly A and AA schools with a couple of large schools also in the mix.

Eli Halcomb paced the Tigers again with a second-place finish, narrowly behind Waldron's Jacob James who qualified for the state finals last year as an individual. Quaid Mull ran a personal best time of 18:05.59 to finish tenth, Quentin Osborne was eleventh, Blake Creech, fifteenth in a season-best time, Adam Nadler, 21st, Carter Jenkins, 30th also in a personal-best time of 19:30.8, and Joey Auker, 48th, of 96 runners. The team average of 18:10 was the best result for the boys so far this season. The Lady Tigers also ran their best team-average time of the season at 24:26 and placed a very respectable fourth as a team, somewhat above their expected finish, largely due to strong showings by Haven Ragen and Taylor Pass. Ava Moore was the Tiger frontrunner, scoring at 18th, with Ragen close behind in 19th in a personal-best time of 23:53.3, Ella Nicholson, 22nd, Pass 26th, and Jewels Warfel 35th completing the scoring. Jenna Smith was 39th and Teresa Rojas 46th. Marissa Slagle also ran a personal-best time in the JV race.
