VARSITY CROSS COUNTRY

Halcomb Repeats as TEC CC Champ, Teams Place Second

Elijah Halcomb won the individual boys' TEC cross country championship for the second consecutive year, running an impressive 16:58.7 on the rigorous course at Union City's Harter Park.

The boys placed second as a team behind defending champ Lincoln who put four runners in the top ten. Quentin Osborne earned All-TEC honors along with Halcomb by placing ninth, but Blake Creech, in his best race of the year, just missed a top-ten spot, placing eleventh. Quaid Mull was close behind in 12th. Adam Nadler placed 21st, Carter Jenkins 22nd, and Joey Auker 30th.

Ava Moore earned All-TEC for the Lady Tigers by placing eighth, and the girls were solid across the board, though handily outpaced by a very strong Centerville squad. Taylor Pass was 16th, Ella Nicholson 17th, Jewels Warfel 19th, Jenna

Smith 21st, Haven Regan 22nd, and Teresa Rojas 29th, to put all seven girls in the top 30.

Coach Kent Gray commented, “I was happy with our overall performances today, for the boys and girls both. Halcomb just dominated his race, Blake Creech ran his heart out today, and our team times for both sexes were close to our best of the year on a demanding course. Our ladies really scrapped for every place to pull a second. Ava Moore passed three Centerville girls in the final 200 meters to take eighth, and Taylor Pass and Jenna Smith probably had their best outings of the season. If we run as well at sectional next week as we did here, we will certainly be taking both squads to the regional.”

Halcomb Wins Connersville Sectional, Both Teams Advance

For the second consecutive year, Eli Halcomb ran away from the field at the 13-school Connersville Sectional to win the individual title. Halcomb led by about 30 meters by the 1K mark and continued to extend his lead through the race, taking advantage of his superior hill-running skills. Halcomb will be ranked among the top competitors at the Rushville Regional as he looks to advance to the Shelbyville Semi-State.

As a team, the Tigers placed third behind Rushville and Lincoln, placing four athletes in the top twenty. Quaid Mull and Blake Creech ran excellent races to place 12th and 13th, Quentin Osborne was solid at 17th. Adam Nadler completed the scoring at 31st.

The Lady Tigers managed to capture the last advancing team spot in the girls' race by placing fifth. Ava Moore landed in the top 20 at 15th. Ella Nicholson placed 23rd, Jewels Warfel 27th, Jenna Smith 31st and Taylor Pass 32nd.
