Student Instructions to Apply for Scholarships at the Wayne County Foundation

New Applicants/First Time Users

1. Visit our online application website:
<https://waynecofdn scholars.communityforce.com/Funds/Search.aspx>
2. Click the login button at the top right side of the screen
3. Click on the Create New Account Button
4. Complete the registration form and click submit
5. Then sign in to the system with your email address provided in the registration and the password you created. Save this information in a safe place so that you have it to apply for other scholarships.
6. Click on the blue Apply Link for the **2020 Wayne County Foundation Scholarships**
7. Complete the Applicant Information Section
8. Next, complete the Request Section. This will allow your Guidance Counselor and the person you are asking to submit a letter of recommendation some time to complete them.
9. It is best to compose the Personal Insight Section (Essay) in Microsoft Word first to allow time for editing, spell check, and grammar. This can then be copied into the Personal Insight Section in the application. Do not include your name in the essay!
10. Complete each section of the application so that all sections are 100% complete.
11. Preview the application once all sections are complete
12. Certify that the application is true and accurate to the best of your knowledge.
13. Click the Final Review & Submit.

The African American Scholarship of Richmond/Wayne County Criteria:

- Students must present evidence of college acceptance
- Students must have at least a C+ average
- Each student must submit the application along with a high school

transcript and two letters of recommendation from persons knowledgeable of the student's potential for success.

Mary E. Hill Scholarship criteria:

- Students must be a Wayne County resident and interested in completing a degree in medical or medically-related fields/careers.

The Wayne County College Fund criteria:

- The Wayne County College Fund is designed to help you with "last dollar" financial assistance for tuition and books. To be eligible you must be a graduate of a Wayne County high school and have filed for federal and state financial aid programs and attend either Earlham, IU East, Ivy Tech, or Purdue Polytechnic Richmond. Awards will be paid when students confirm that they have enrolled at one of the colleges. Applicants must have applied for financial aid and college of choice

must confirm unmet need or student loans.
