At dismissal, the staff of the Boys & Girls Club is just arriving and provides students in Grades 1 through 12 with quality after-school childcare for hundreds of our students! Parents who work greatly appreciate that this program is available until 6:00P.M. daily to watch over their children providing recreational and educational activities. The staff does such a great job that you would never know that over 100 students regularly stay safely at school until Mom or Dad stops by to pick them up. A fifteen-dollar annual membership fee is all it takes to have one's child receive help with



homework or to play with friends after school. A different after-school tutoring program is also in session in the library after the buses leave. School counselor, Ms. Kaiser, and CIS coordinator, Ms. Ullery, stay after school and provide academic tutoring for students to help keep everyone's learning on track. You Are What You Eat!




