2017-2018 Registration Dates & Times!

With more grades moving to 1:1 technology, more courses taking advantage of online learning materials, and grade levels K-12 using MAP testing in August, we are holding Registration Days for both school buildings in June so that all of the technology will be ready to go on the first day of the new school year. Feedback from parents indicates that they like a June registration with the opportunity to pay book fees so that the bill can be paid before the other expenses connected with school that arise in August come along. Registration for the 2017-2018 school year will be as follows:

Grades K-6 at Hagerstown Elementary School - Wednesday, June 7th from 12:00P.M. to 7:00P.M. and Thursday, June 8th from 8:00A.M. to 3:00P.M.
Grades 7-12 at Hagerstown Jr./Sr. High School - Wednesday, June 7th and Thursday, June 8th from 11:00A.M. to 7:00P.M.

Success By The Numbers!

In February we received confirmation that Hagerstown Jr./Sr. High School's graduation rate set a new school record with 95.9% of the Class of 2016 graduating on time. A month later, HJr./Sr.H was listed as a Top Ten High School in Indiana by the College Board for its Advanced Placement program. Now, *U. S. News & World Report* ranked Hagerstown Jr./Sr. High School as a Top 100 High School of nearly 600 schools in the State of Indiana. Hagerstown Jr./Sr. High School also was recognized in National Rankings and earned a Bronze Medal. U.S. News & World Report ranks schools based on their performance on state-required tests and how well they prepare students for college.



Learning Is An Ongoing Process!

While most of us think of a school year's timeline in terms of August to May, Project Child classrooms take a multiple-year approach to learning. Students in the Intermediate Program shared progress reports recently of projects that began last year, continued through this year and will continue to be developed by students into the future.

While standards-based, the secret to this longevity began when teachers took students through a guided process that helped students identify projects about which they are passionate. Their passion, not a deadline, has fueled student success all along the way. Genius Hour in these classrooms

provides the time for individuals and groups of students to make progress on their projects. Topics selected for research and development range from technology development and manufacture to assistive orthopedic device development. Students journal their progress and maintain websites with student-made videos that chronicle their progress. We send a tip of the Tiger's tail to these students for their perseverance and to their program teachers as well as teachers outside of the program who are working together to guide our students through this deeply worthwhile opportunity to take charge of their learning!
