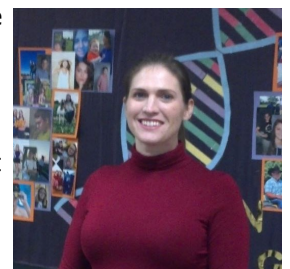

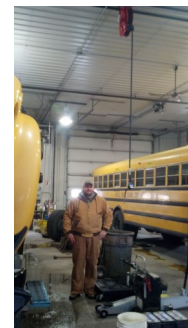
Thank You HES PTO!
